### What is the Point-in-Time Count?

Federal Program

When do we perform the count?

#### Overview

- The Point in Time (PIT) is a count of people within the Continuum of Care's geographic region who are experiencing homelessness. This includes people in
- ES-Emergency Shelter
- TS-Transitional Housing
- SH-Safe Haven(s)
- Unsheltered Situations

Permanently Housed people within the CoC are also counted:

- RRH Rapid Rehousing
- PSH Permanent
   Supportive Housing



# Point in Time Count

#### Why we do this:

In combination with the Housing Inventory Count (HIC), this informs HUD of the capacity to meet the needs of people experiencing homelessness in your CoC

- Coordinated through an online database where every agency either reviews (HMIS participant projects) or enters (non-HMIS participating projects) the total people served on the night of the count
- Regional Coordinators work with CoC Leadership, providers, ACT, and Nutmeg to ensure all projects enter and/or verify data in a timely fashion

# Rapid Rehousing

- Must wait to confirm bed inventories until after night of the count 1/24/2023
  - Enter and/or confirm data by 1/31/2023
  - After confirmation HIC auto-populates to match the household and people counts

# New: Emergency Shelter & Transitional Housing

- Age categories to be collected:
  - Under 18
  - 18 24
  - 25 − 34
  - 35 44
  - 45 54
  - 55 − 64
  - Over 64
- HMIS participating programs categories will be pulled from HMIS
- Non-HMIS participating programs collect and enter this data

# All Projects

- Each Project is responsible for entering and/or verifying:
  - All people count data for the night of 1/24/23
- 1/24/23: Night of the Point in Time Count
- 1/25/23: Begin data entry and/or confirmation
- 1/31/23: Deadline for all data entry and/or confirmation
